New Apparel Legislation in New York

A new bill introduced in New York state will affect the biggest brands and hold them accountable for their impacts on people and the planet.

Assembly Bill A8352, also known as the “fashion act”, enforces that apparel and footwear retailers with at least \$100 million in revenue and conduct business in New York must:

- Map at least half of their supply chains
- Disclose their environmental and social impacts
- Set binding science-based targets to ensure that they’re reducing their greenhouse-gas emissions in line with the Paris Agreement
- Divulge the annual volume of material produced, broken down by type, such as polyester or cotton
- Disclose the median pay of workers as measured against local minimum and living wages.
